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PREFACE

Correspondence courses provide students who have unique needs with reasonable opportunities to fulfill both district and state requirements for graduation. While such courses are valuable in assisting some students to complete their secondary education, they should be used with prudence and discretion.

To protect the interests of students and to guarantee that the correspondence courses they complete fulfill state and district expectations, the Boise District has prepared this booklet that contains a listing of courses which district subject-area supervisors certify as containing content that satisfies graduation requirements.

Contained in this catalog are approved courses in business and computer education, world language, health, technology education, language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies, which may be completed for correspondence credit at the institutions most frequently used by students from the Boise District.

Because the number of correspondence programs available nationally is so large and because it is difficult to assess the quality of each of these programs, the Boise District will accept correspondence credit only through the University of Idaho, Brigham Young University, Portland State University, and the University of Arizona. The University of Arizona is accredited by the North Central Association. The University of Idaho, Brigham Young University, and Portland State University programs are sanctioned through the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools.

The courses identified on the following pages have been found to contain content that parallels the course content required by the Boise School District and/or the State of Idaho. When taken from their respective institutions, any of these courses may be used in lieu of similar classes taught in the Boise District's high schools.

The Boise School District allows three credits to be earned through correspondence study. These courses should be completed by the end of the summer school session that follows the graduation exercises. Only that correspondence study which has been approved in advance by a student's counselor or principal will be accepted for credit.

When considering a student's involvement in a correspondence course, the following should be kept in mind:

“No student shall be approved for a correspondence course except under extraordinary conditions or extenuating circumstances. The allowance of correspondence work in courses currently being offered by the high schools should be soundly justified.”
