The Boise Independent School District will once again offer a secondary summer school for students that failed required courses or who are seeking to take required courses for scheduling purposes. This program will offer students in grade 9-12 an opportunity to take up to four credits toward graduation requirements.

Registration:

Registration will take place in buildings with school counselors. **Registration forms will be accepted starting March 16th through May 22nd.** After May 22nd, registrations will only be accepted at Timberline High School from 5-8 PM on the following dates: Wednesday June 3rd 2009, and Monday June 8, Monday.

*Any student not enrolled in a BSD school during 2008-2009 school year must pay a \$10.00 per credit transcript handling fee. Please include a copy of transcripts with registration.

Refunds:

A written, dated request is needed to process a refund.

Full refund will be available prior to the first day of class, 75% the first day of class, and 50% on the second day. **The \$30 registration fee is non-refundable.** No refunds will be made after the second day of class.

Student Policies and Procedures

Students will be held to the policies and procedures of the Independent School District of Boise City as communicated in “A Student’s Guide to Rights and Responsibilities.” Students should refer to this publication, available in their home schools’ offices, for a full reference. Particularly relevant policies and procedures are detailed below:

Attendance: Students must attend 90% of the time to receive credit. Only **two** full-day absences (8 hours) are allowed in each 19-day session. This policy will be strictly enforced due to the condensed summer school format. If students have obligations such as camps or family vacations that would require them to be absent longer than two days, they should not register. **If your child is absent, please call the Summer School office to excuse the absence within 24 hours.**

Tardies: Only six tardies per semester in each class are allowed. Students will be dropped from the class if they are tardy a seventh time. After 20 minutes, a tardy becomes an absence. **Students should synchronize their watches with the Timberline High School clocks and pay close attention to 2-minute warning bells.**

Discipline: Dangerous and disruptive behavior is prohibited. Suspensions and/or removals from class because of violations of Boise School District policies will count against attendance. Incurring a major disciplinary violation may result in immediate removal from the program. Major disciplinary violations include: insubordination, theft, vandalism, verbal and/or physical abuse, hazing, fighting, possession of illegal substances (including drugs, alcohol, and tobacco), bomb threats and false fire alarms. Students cannot possess fireworks, weapons, matches or lighters on school grounds.

Dress Code: Clothes, tattoos, and/or accessories that are immodest, disruptive or gang-related are not appropriate. Students’ clothing must cover their midriffs. **A good rule to follow is: full front, full back and sleeves to the shoulder.** Unless otherwise authorized by the principal, hats cannot be worn during school hours, and shoes are required at all times. **The dress code applies to physical education students as well as to students in other classes.**

Grades and Exams: Because all final exams, including end-of-course exams in the appropriate subjects, will be given during the morning on July 2 and July 31, students must make arrangements to be present. Midterm progress reports will be given to students to take home on June 15 for first semester and July 14 for second semester. Providing that all tuition and fees are paid in full, final semester grades will be mailed home the week of July 6 for first semester and August 3 for second semester. Students’ grades will not be sent to their home schools to be posted to their transcripts until all tuition and fees have been paid in full.

Transportation: Students and/or their parents are responsible for transportation to and from summer school. A summer-use pass for the city bus, valid from May 30 through August 31, may be purchased beginning May 15th at certain Albertson’s and Winco for \$24. Check with the counselor’s office at the student’s school or call Valley Ride at 336-1010 for information on passes and schedules. Skateboards and roller blades are not allowed on campus.

Lunch: Regular school lunch will not be available. Because the lunch break is only a half of an hour long, students are encouraged to bring a lunch from home. There are several restaurants close to campus, but it will be difficult for students to eat at one of them and make it back to class on time. Periodically school clubs and organizations may sell pizza, sandwiches or rice bowls. Such occasions will be announced.

Campus Restrictions and Parking: Lunch is the only time students can leave campus. Students may not leave during breaks. Safety rules for the parking lot will be strictly enforced and students will be ticketed for reckless driving. **Students and Staff are asked to park in the back parking lot by the gym off Apple Street.**

Finances: If checks are returned because of insufficient funds, the checks must clear by the second week of school, or the student will be withdrawn. **Students removed due to attendance, tardy or discipline infractions will not receive a refund of tuition or fees.**

Student Responsibilities: Students are expected to respect staff, peers and property. Food and drink, with the exception of water in clear bottles, are not allowed in the classrooms. **Cell phones and CD players will not be allowed in class because of possible disruption and the potential for theft.**

Application Process:

MAKE A NOTE OF YOUR CHILD’S CLASSES, TIMES AND DATES. YOU WILL NOT RECEIVE REGISTRATION VERIFICATION. IF A PROBLEM ARISES WITH YOUR CHILD’S REGISTRATION, A SUMMER SCHOOL STAFF MEMBER WILL CONTACT YOU. OTHERWISE, YOUR CHILD SHOULD ARRIVE AT TIMBERLINE THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL. CLASSROOM NUMBER ASSIGNMENTS WILL BE POSTED THAT DAY AT THE BACK ENTRANCE OF TIMBERLINE HIGH SCHOOL.**
